Policy

Academic honesty and integrity are expected of all Early Light Academy students. Academic dishonesty, including cheating and plagiarism, will not be tolerated and will be cause for discipline, including loss of credit and lowering of the citizenship grade.

Cheating includes but is not limited to:


- Copying other individuals' work.
- Giving or receiving improper assistance on an assignment meant to be individual work.
- Having or using notes when not authorized to do so.
- Improperly using another individual's notes.
- Having or using a communication device to send or obtain unauthorized information about coursework or tests.
- Taking an exam for another individual or having another individual take an exam for oneself.
- Giving or taking exam answers to or from someone else.
- Altering a grade, assignment score, exam, or exam score.
- Improperly working together on an assignment or take-home exam.
- Gaining or providing to others unauthorized access to exam materials.

Plagiarism includes but is not limited to:

- Including in any assignment that is turned in for credit any materials not based on one's own research and writing, including:
 - submitting as one's own work material obtained from a commercial term paper company;
 - submitting as one's own work material created by another individual;
 - copying all or part of another person's paper and submitting it as one's own;
 - acting as a provider of paper(s) for other individuals to submit as their own work;
 - submitting substantial portions of the same academic work for credit in more than one course without consulting both teachers;
 - submitting as one's own work substantial portions of outside sources without putting information into the one's own words and/or properly attributing the source of the work;
 - citing nonexistent sources, such as articles, books, or websites.
